HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Not regarded as a health hazard under current legislation.

FIRST AID MEASURES

Accidental over exposure may result in the following symptoms:-

Prolonged and repeated contact with solvents over a long period may lead to permanent health problems.

Skin Contact - may cause skin irritation.

Eye Contact - may cause eye irritation.

In case of accident or if you feel unwell seek medical advice immediately (show the label where possible).

Additional medical guidance is available to doctors from the National Poisons Information Service.

In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Inhalation - move the patient to fresh air at once. Rinse nose and mouth with water. Obtain medical attention if any discomfort continues.

Eye Contact - make sure to remove any contact lenses from the eyes before rinsing. Promptly wash eyes with plenty of water while lifting the eyelids. Continue to rinse for at least 15 minutes. Obtain medical attention if any discomfort continues.

Skin Contact - remove contaminated clothing. Wash the skin immediately with soap and water if symptoms occur after washing.

Ingestion - DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. Rinse mouth thoroughly. Obtain medical attention. Provide rest, warmth and fresh air.

FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing Media: use water spray, powder, Carbon dioxide (CO₂) or Alcohol resistant foam.

Special Fire Fighting Procedures and Equipment: avoid water in straight hose stream; will scatter and spread fire. Containers close to fire should be removed or cooled with water. Keep run-off water out of sewers and water sources. Dike for water control.

Hazardous Decomposition Products: Fire creates Carbon monoxide (CO), Carbon dioxide (CO₂).

Protective Measures in Fire: suitable self-contained breathing apparatus should be used in confined spaces.

ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Spillages: absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Flush with plenty of water to clean spillage area.

HANDLING & STORAGE

Handling: avoid spilling, skin and eye contact.

Storage: store in original containers, tightly closed in a secure, well ventilated, cool but frost-free, dry area. Store between 4°C and 40°C.

**EXPOSURE CONTROLS/
PERSONAL PROTECTION**

Well ventilated area. Normal good hygiene standards should be observed.
Wear approved safety goggles and protective rubber gloves.
Provide eyewash station.
Promptly remove any clothing that becomes contaminated. Wash promptly if skin becomes wet. No eating or drinking while working with this material.
